CNO Corner - What's New

Shared governance is a leadership model with the objectives to place control of the professional nursing practice decision-making authority to those that influence and provide direct care of the patient. It centers on the autonomy of nursing practice and the accountability of the RN in his or her professional role.

This month we began our new fiscal year with a steering committee of staff RNs, nurse leaders, quality initiative leaders, educators, HR leaders and Quality & Safety staff with the goal to learn the purpose and benefits of shared governance and its philosophical underpinnings. This steering committee began developing policy around council structure, communication process between councils and definition of roles, authority and responsibility of each council. Once the foundation of the council organization chart is set, there will be dissemination of house-wide education to align the hospital strategy and the nursing

strategy with shared governance practice.

Service Initiatives

- Whiteboard trial completed and we are in process of ordering boards for Med Surg and CC clusters.
- Physician leadership attended Compassionate Care Training.
- Outpatient Lactation room complete and we are finalizing the workflow processes and anticipate being able to see patients next month.
- Continue to focus on hourly, charge nurse and leader rounding.

Quality initiatives

- o Pyxis upgrade training for all nursing staff completed. Go live with new process scheduled on 9/13.
- WOW! Another great survey! Our Hip and Knee program was recertified by The Joint Commission without deficiencies.
- Working on transitions of care for dialysis on day of discharge (DOD) and options are being evaluated for transport on DOD to improve patient flow.
- Working with Quality to develop templates and distribute data monthly at unit based levels.

- Working with M/B and L/D staff and CNA on proposed new schedules for a blend of 8 hour and 12 hour shifts.
- Nursing Residents have been interviewed and selected.

Finance Initiatives

- We have temporarily made a decision to stop Tagnos tags in the ED and Inpatient areas during construction period. We will continue to optimize the Tagnos processes in OR and asset tagging.





SVMHS Supports Firefighters

As firefighters from across the state rolled into action to fight the Soberanes Fire in Big Sur, so too did Salinas Valley Memorial Healthcare System (SVMHS) and members of the community. Shortly after the fire started on July 22, SVMHS contacted the Command Center and asked how we could help. CalFire gave us a list of medical and personal hygiene supplies firefighters needed. As an organization we made four deliveries to the Medical Emergency Response Team (MERT) at the Toro Park Command Center. Those donations included poison oak treatment, Calamine lotion, Tecnu Calagel, bath wipes, sunscreen, toothbrushes, toothpaste and non-perishable food.

"We are providing much needed supplies to the firefighters protecting our community," said Pete Delgado, President/CEO of SVMHS. "All of us are grateful for the work they are doing to contain the fire and protect homes and property. The donations allow us to say thank you in a meaningful way."

"I've never seen a hospital respond in the way Salinas Valley Memorial has," says Darin Nelson, CalFire Captain and Medical Services Team Leader. "We are very grateful for all of the donations, especially the poison oak treatments and bath wipes."

Employees also rallied to help. SVMHS set up donation bins in the cafeteria and staff started filling the barrels. Employee Health took those staff donations to the Big Sur area, where volunteer firefighters are stationed.

One SVMHS nurse went above and beyond to help firefighters and fire personnel by donating six bags of supplies and non-perishable food such as beef jerky. "Our first responders are warriors just like nurses," said Ruthie Andrews, RN from the Mother and Baby Unit. "When the call for donations went out, my heart was lead to help. I love letting the firefighters know that Salinas Valley Memorial and all of us here appreciate the work they do."

As the firefighters work to contain the Soberanes Fire in Big Sur, we want to express our appreciation to everyone who has supported our first responders. Special shout outs to **Kyle Dixon** in Materials Management, **Jill Peralta-Cuellar** in Employee Health and **Nutrition Services** for the efforts they made to support the fire crews.
